Public Law 9-208 established the Department of Corrections (DOC) within the executive branch of the Government of Guam on July 18, 1968. Governor Manuel F.L. Guerrero enacted Executive Order 68-23, transferring the Guam Penitentiary from the Department of Public Safety to the Department of Corrections, effective November 1, 1968.


-Percentage of sentenced inmates who have a prior misdemeanor or felony conviction.


BED CAPACITY: 135%



CHALLENGES

- DepCor continues to struggle with an overcrowded, old dilapidated facility.
- A critical shortage of Corrections Officers
- Several escapes throughout the year.
- Several officers tested positive for drug use.

OUTLOOK

Moving forward, one positive step at a time:

- DepCor held several job fairs to recruit more Corrections Officers.
- 25 inmates participate in a construction certification program funded by the Guam Economic Development Authority in collaboration with the Guam Trades Academy.
- Robert D. Camacho assumes command of DepCor after Joseph S. Carbullido returns to GPD.
- Plan to recruit sixty Corrections Officers.
- Inmate family visitation resumes after a two-year suspension due to COVID-19.
- The Attorney General looks at deportation as a way of freeing up space in the prison.
- Governor signs Bill 153-36, "The Department of Corrections Modernization Act of 2021."
